BIKE SAFETY

When you ride your bike on Campus footpaths, go slowly and remember to yield to pedestrians.

Always give an audible warning when overtaking a pedestrian. Remember, they may not be able to see or hear you approaching. Their safety depends on your courtesy.

When you ride on the road your bike is a vehicle and therefore you must obey all traffic laws.

Watch for cars pulling out. Assume the drivers don't see you until you are sure they do.

Always use a strong headlight and tail light at night or when visibility is poor.

Pedestrians have right of way on campus.

BIKE SECURITY

Bike theft is a city-wide problem and Curtin University is not immune.

Bicycles can be extremely valuable and are the most frequently stolen type of property at Curtin University.

Most bicycles stolen are either unlocked or secured with poor-quality locks.

To reduce the risk of having your bike stolen and increase the chances of it being retrieved if it is, we recommend you take the following steps:

- Where possible use the secure bike racks on campus.
- Always use a quality lock to secure your bike to a bike rack.
- Report suspicious activity, particularly around bike racks.
- Photograph your bike and its serial number to keep for your records.
- Engrave your drivers licence number onto your bike. This will enable easy identification of ownership should the bike be recovered.

Please report all incidences of damage or theft to Security.

TRANSPERTH TRAIN & TRANSPORT WA INFORMATION AND LINKS

The following link may assist you to plan your route. The green and blue routes on the Perth Bike Map Series are the recommended roads to use. Blue routes are signed routes that connect local areas and the green routes identify a low-stress road environment.

END OF TRIP FACILITIES

Please refer to the map and legend for the location of all bike racks. Cora racks are open, unsecured bike racks which are accessible to anyone on campus.

Secure bike racks are enclosed bicycle storage facilities accessed by student and staff identification cards. To apply to have access to these facilities added to your card please visit the Security Office (Building 115) between 9am and 5pm, Monday to Friday.

Toilet, change and shower facilities are available at the following locations on campus:

Building 107 - Edinburgh Sports Pavilion
